PASTOR JAMES M. HUTCHINS

A native of Carthage, Mississippi, James M. Hutchins was reared in Marion, Indiana. He gave his life to Jesus Christ in 1982 and answered the call to ministry in 1984 while serving with the United States Navy. Throughout the country, he has served in various capacities that include teacher, counselor, and various ministries. After 20 years serving with the navy, he retired in 2000. Along with 25 members, Pastor Hutchins founded New Life Community Church in Frisco, Texas in 2007 where he faithfully serves a congregation of about 1,000 to this day. He has authored four books and travels yearly to foreign countries on a mission to impact his generation. As a result, he also began a church in Zimbabwe in 2016. He is known as a community leader and advocate of peace and unity. He earned an Associate of Arts from Columbia College, a Bachelor of Science in Resource Management from Troy State University, and a Masters of Divinity from Christian Bible Seminary. Additionally, he is currently completing his Masters in Pastoral Ministry from Bethany Theological Seminary. He is married to his high school sweetheart, Tina, and they have three children, Tinesha, Jasmine, and Terrance. In addition, they have four grandsons, Jaylen, Aiden, Jaxson, and Aaron, and two granddaughters, Jayda and Abigail. DCC is honored to introduce James M. THE MACE

"Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you." Hebrews 13:17 (NIV)

The mace has historically been a symbol of progress and authority dating from the early Middle Ages in Europe. The mace of the College, made of mesquite wood harvested on the DCC campus, has three rings on its ferrule that represent the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit and five rings on the collar for the College's core values and mission. On the head, unadorned, stands the cross of Christ, the most important symbol of all.

The DCC mace is carried by the president, in whom the authority is vested by the Board of Trustees to govern the institution.





THE SHEPHERD'S STAFF

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The American tradition of wearing academic regalia originated in medieval European universities. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class and since most universities at that time were under the jurisdiction of the church, academic dress became an adaptation of the cape or mantle, which was usually of silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

The gowns commonly have pointed sleeves for bachelor's degree, long, closed sleeves (with a slit for the arm) for the master's degree, and bell-shaped, open sleeves for the doctor's degree. The gown for the doctor's degree is faced down the front with velvet trim and three bars of the same trim across the sleeves. The trim, hoods, and tassels may be black or of the color distinctive of the faculty or subject to which the degree pertains.
