Sixty-two percent of last year's graduates indicated they planned to go into ministry, but DCC believes strongly that more men and women need to consider ministry. DCC COACH TYESE LITTLE RECEIVES AWARD

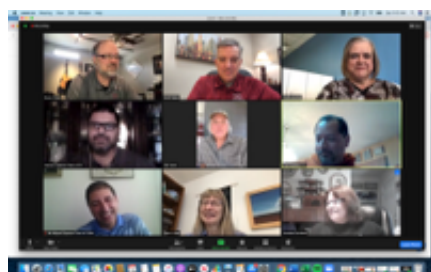

DCC SERVES IN A POWERFUL WAY

Several of DCC's sports teams, along with additional students and staff, partnered with Compass Christian Church in their annual Meal Marathon. Over 75 students, faculty, and staff helped to prepare 600,000 meals for Haitian and Navajo people. In September, DCC faculty and staff partnered with Children's Hunger Fund and Compass Christian Church to prepare over 91,350 meals for Cuban children. Mentoring groups and sports teams have also gone back to Children's Hunger Fund (the center is near DCC) to serve together. As Director of Student Development, Karla Kuhl, said, "It's been a great semester of serving for our students."

E.L. and Sue Derr School of Teaching Receives State Approval

The E.L. and Sue Derr Teacher Education Department teacher education program underwent a periodic five-year review with the Texas Education Agency (TEA). TEA determined the DCC teacher education program does meet the standards and requirements established by the Texas State Board of Education (SBEC). This official SBEC notification (Oct. 20, 2020) allows the DCC teacher education program to continue to operate as an approved educator preparation program in Texas for another five years (next review in 2024-2025). TEA stated – "We congratulate you on your work and recognize that this accomplishment comes as the result of the time, energy, and effort you and your staff invested to reach this point. We look forward to continuing to work with you in the goal to have educators prepared on

day one to serve Texas students effectively". DCC is listed on the TX state TEA website (with a direct link to the DCC website).

Teacher Education Department Chair, Mrs. Caroline Worley, stated, "This TEA approval allows DCC to continue to prepare future teachers in their 'Calling' to become a Texas state certified teacher serving in a public, charter, private, or private Christian school. Our teacher education students definitely will have a positive influence on children's lives."

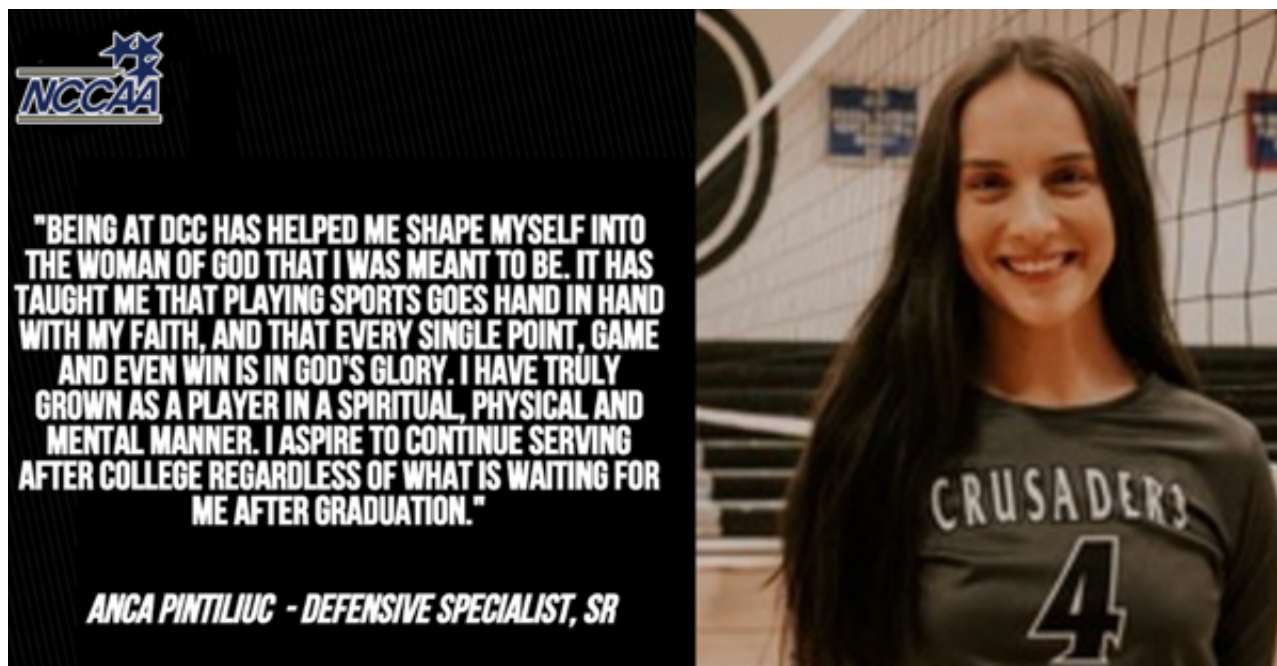


DCC ATHLETICS
