### DR. STANLEY MUTUNGA

Dr. Stanley Mutunga, a native of Kenya and the youngest of 10 children, came to an appreciation of the value of education much later in life than most. He started school at 12 years old, but eventually would go on to earn a bachelor's degree in Theology from Scott Christian University, a master's degree in Cross-Cultural Studies from Fuller Theological Seminary, and a doctorate in Intercultural Studies also from Fuller Theological Seminary, and a doctorate studies at the University of California, Los Angeles. Prior to coming to the U.S. to study Dr. Mutunga planted and led churches in Kenya. Later he worked with missionary organizations such as World Vision International and the Association of Evangelicals of Africa. He has also been an educator both in Kenya – serving as the Vice President for Academic Affairs at Africa International University – and in the U.S. – serving as Dean and Professor in the School of Graduate Studies at Hope International University.

While at Hope, Dr. Mutunga lost several family members to the AIDS epidemic in Kenya. His family's overwhelming losses revealed to him the ordeal many AIDS orphans were facing. In order to meet the multi-faceted needs of these orphans, he began Tumaini International. Tumaini International helps place AIDS-affected children in homes through their Extended Family Care program. They also provide education, technical training, assist with business startup loans and grants, and host free medical clinics. Dr. Mutunga currently serves as Tumaini International's President and CEO and most recently as a Trustee at Dallas Christian College. He is also an author of many articles and the book, *No Longer Forgotten: Incredible Stories of Faith, Hope and Resilience.* He is an avid mountain climber (successfully climbing Mount Kilimanjaro three times). He and his wife, Rose, have three grown sons. DCC is honored to welcome this year's Commencement Speaker, Dr. Stanley Mutunga.

## THE MACE

"Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you." Hebrews 13:17 (NIV)

The mace has historically been a symbol of progress and authority dating from the early Middle Ages in Europe. The mace of the College, made of mesquite wood harvested on the DCC campus, has three rings on its ferrule that represent the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit and five rings on the collar for the College's core values and mission. On the head, unadorned, stands the cross of Christ, the most important symbol of all. The DCC mace is carried by the president, in whom the authority is vested by the Board of Trustees to govern the institution.

# ACADEMIC REGALIA

The American tradition of wearing academic regalia originated in medieval European universities. Since the clergy composed the majority of the educated class and since most universities at that time were under the jurisdiction of the church, academic dress became an adaptation of the cape or mantle, which was usually of silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

The gowns commonly have pointed sleeves for bachelor's degree, long, closed sleeves (with a slit for the arm) for the master's degree, and bell-shaped, open sleeves for the doctor's degree. The gown for the doctor's degree is faced down the front with velvet trim and three bars of the same trim across the sleeves. The trim, hoods, and tassels may be black or a color distinctive of the faculty or subject to which the degree pertains.
